Official language: Finnish and Swedish

Prevalence of French or English speaking: English is widely spoken, limited to no French.

# **QUALITY OF LIFE**

# Climate and potential for severe weather, natural disasters:

Severe cold weather and deep snow coverage occurs in winter.

## Laws and Culture:

- You must be at least 18 years of age to drive a car in Finland.
- It is recommended to carry an international driving permit (IDP).
- Penalties for drinking and driving are severe. The legal blood alcohol limit for drivers is 0.05%.
   Drivers who register this level or above may be arrested immediately.
- Penalties for possession, use or trafficking of illegal drugs are severe. Convicted offenders can expect a jail sentence and a heavy fine.
- If you are a Canadian citizen, but also a citizen of Finland, ability to offer you consular services may be limited while you're there.

# Safety and Security:

- The crime rate is low; however, petty crime (pickpocketing and purse snatching) occurs.
- Be especially vigilant when using ATMs at Helsinki's railway station, metro and Esplanade, and on trams.

## Level of isolation:

- There is only 1 Canadian family posted to this location,
- It is considered remote, the level of isolation is high.
- French-Speaking spouses may feel very isolated if they do not speak English fluently.

## **HOUSING**

• It is recommended that you ask your sponsor, during your HHT for a list of all the points of contact at CFSU(E) in Geilenkirchen so you can call if you encounter any support issues as you transition to your rental property.

#### **EMPLOYMENT**

Are there employment opportunities for spouses? Due to tax and legal implications, spousal employment on the economy is not a realistic option.

- Limited due to language barrier.
- There are very limited employment opportunities available through CFMWS, families should plan to be single income for the duration of the posting.
- Employment is extremely limited. Families should plan to be a single-income family for the duration of the posting. **CFMWS | MFS | OUTCAN Europe | CFMWS**

**Op Tempo:** The op tempo will vary greatly depending on position. TD is possible.

#### **HEALTH CARE**

Access: Finland scores overall very high on different rankings in health care performances worldwide.

- Highly accessible via private clinic (almost no wait times), public access very similar to Canada, including wait times.
- English services are widely available, French is very limited.
- The Canadian Medical Clinic in Geilenkirchen is responsible for the healthcare of all Canadian military members in Europe and can be accessed.
- All bills associated with the care of dependents are the member's personal responsibility and are to be claimed through PSHCP. **PSHCP Member Portal (pshcp-msh.ca)**

## Special needs:

- Depending on language required (English/French), area of specialization and degree of support needed.
- It may be a wait before finding an appropriate match and at times may not be possible based on availability of English/French speaking providers or resources.
- It is highly advised that the family consult with Medical Screening Officer in Canada and / or the Canadian Element to ensure that the required services are readily available in either English or French before accepting a posting.

**Consideration for pregnancy / birth:** Health care for pregnancy and birth is available on the economy, private care.

**Dental:** Dental care can be accessed in town. You are required to pay up front, and you can then claim your expenses.
